Safeguarding: Trussell Trust

Trussell Trust support a nationwide network of food banks and provide emergency food and support to people locked in poverty, and campaign for change to end the need for food banks in the UK.




In the UK, more than 14 million people are living in poverty – including 4.5 million children. Trussell Trust support more than 1,200 food bank centres in the UK to provide a minimum of three days' nutritionally-balanced emergency food to people who have been referred in crisis, as well as support to help people resolve the crises they face. Between April 2018 and March 2019, Trussell Trust food banks provided a record 1.6 million food supplies to people in crisis, a 19% increase on the previous year.



At St. Clement's C of E Academy we work in partnership with Trussell Trust and can provide Food Bank Vouchers for family in crisis. If you need further information or support regarding accessing, food, clothing or shelter please see Miss Akers.
