

## Problem Parking and Junior PCSO's

We have had several complaints from local residents of Butlin Street and Stuart Street about inconsiderate, dangerous and illegal parking that happens when children are dropped off and picked up.

Driveways in the area must never be blocked in anyway, pavements must not be parked on, even partially, road junctions must not be obstructed and zig zags never stopped on.

The school and West Midlands Police will be working closely together to implement the 'Junior PCSO' programme within the school and Police will train specifically selected pupils to be Junior PCSO's.

One of their duties will be to perform high visibility patrols with Police officers outside school at regular intervals, speaking with drivers about their inconsiderate, illegal or dangerous parking. If necessary, the Junior PCSO's will issue specially designed 'tickets' to drivers. If a driver receives two of these tickets and the issue of a third becomes necessary, then West Midlands Police will issue the appropriate Fixed Penalty Notice ticket.

I hope that you can support this exciting scheme which will help to make the school and the community around it a safer place for all.
