

Pupil Premium Impact Statement

2016/17

The allocation of Pupil Premium funding proved to be highly impactful on positive outcomes for the pupils at St. Clement's in the academic year 2016/17. This can be seen below in the Academy's attainment outcomes in statutory testing and the improvement made when compared to outcomes for the previous academic year.

End of Key Stage 2 SATs Results Comparison At the time of the 2017 Year 6 SATs tests there were 25 pupils eligible for Pupil Premium funding out of a class of 30 pupils. This represents 83% of the class. At the time that the Academy's Pupil Premium Strategy Statement 2016-17 this figure stood at 74%. This reflects the Academy's very high mobility with 23% of pupils having joined our roll in the last three years at times other than the beginning of the academic year, with equal numbers leaving.

When compared to the outcomes for **Pupil Premium** pupils nationally, the results of pupils eligible for **Pupil Premium** at the Academy were higher in both attainment of the 'expected standard' and scaled scores across all subject areas in Year 6.

When compared to the outcomes for **non-Pupil Premium** outcomes nationally, the results of pupils eligible for **Pupil Premium** at the Academy were in line or higher in both attainment of the 'expected standard' and scaled scores across all subject areas except for Writing in Year 6.

End of Key Stage 1 SATs Results Comparison

At the time of the 2017 Year 1 SATs tests there were 19 pupils eligible for Pupil Premium funding out of a class of 29 pupils. This represents 66% of the class.
