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Safeguarding - Positive Relationships



At St. Clement's Academy we talk, learn and explore the meaning of 'Positive Relationships' from Early Years to Year 6. Positive relationships are a vital part of life and identifying people who bring out the best in us and help us strive to achieve more is very important.

Across the school the children are taught of how to recognise, who and what makes a positive relationship. In the Early Years and KS1 children learn about friendship and making positive choices. As children move through KS2 they are taught how to apply these skills to the wider world and community. As children prepare to leave St. Clement's we ensure we educate them on important current issues such as domestic violence, crimes against women and sexting.


