As a member of Nechells POD CIC St Clement's is involved in the FareShare project.

What is the FareShare Project?

Supermarkets who have surplus food donate these items to FareShare who then redistribute them to charities and community groups.

Every Tuesday, and sometimes on other days of the week, food is delivered to **The POD at 28 Oliver Street**. The available food can include vegetables, tinned foods, dairy products, desserts, ready meals, soups and sandwiches.

We want to give the name and telephone numbers of families who would benefit from this project to the staff at The POD who will phone families in rotation to offer food. If you are sometimes struggling to make ends meet then you could benefit from this scheme.

What do you need to do?

You need to complete a short form available from the office. Once you have agreed to us putting your name forward you may get a phone call from a member of staff from The POD. You need to take two carrier bags to The POD to pick up food on the same day. There can be no guarantees about what sort of food is available, it depends on what is surplus in the supermarkets; it is all good quality but with a short sell by date.

What is the cost?

There is no cost to families. The school and The POD have contributed funds and staff time to make sure we can be a part of the FareShare Project.

We have been analysing the number of children late for school each day. We are very disappointed to note that almost 15% of our children arrive after the 8.55 a.m. bell (that's the equivalent of a whole class!). This must improve as those children, who are often the same children several times a week, are missing important lesson time and the chance to practice their basic skills.

The first bell goes at 8.45 a.m. and you should aim to arrive then. Teachers are ready in classrooms at this time and the children have additional opportunities to look at the work they did the previous day and talk to the teacher about how they can improve. They can't do this if they are arriving late.

I am really glad to see that those parents who I have seen outside school this week have really improved their punctuality so please can everyone make a big effort to get here on time. If this means dropping your child off earlier don't forget we have Breakfast Club from 8.00 a.m. every day.
