'Working Well With Others" is something that the children of St. Clement's Academy do very well and is an important part of social and academic development.

'Collaboration' is one of the schools promoted learning behaviours and helps the children in valuing and respecting others and problem solving. The academies learning behaviours work alongside the classroom zone board.

'The Rocket' is made up of a set of colours. At the top is gold, if children finish their day in gold they get a 'Cosmic Stamp' for their award card. Below gold is silver, then bronze, then orange and finally red. All children start their day in bronze and move up the rocket by showing positive behaviour or completing fantastic work. Behaviour not inline with the academies expectations would see children move down the rocket and appropriate consequences given. When the children have reached gold they may then go planet hoping on one of the learning planets -Collaboration, Respectfulness, Kindness, Absorption, Independence and Perseverance. The 'Rocket' is a fun way to engage children in taking responsibility for their actions and helps them to understand their behaviour. The behaviour and welfare of children at the

academy is paramount and support can always be given.
