




St. Clement's Celebrates World Book Day

On Thursday it was World Book Day and St. Clement's joined in with the celebrations. World Book Day is celebrated in more than 100 countries and is now in its 19th year. The aim of World Book Day is to promote reading for enjoyment and raise money for Book Aid International, which is a charity that provides books and resources to Third world countries.

During the day, children and staff took part in a number of activities to promote reading and books. In the morning, children from KS2 visited children in KS1 and Early years to read with them and share their favourite books. The younger children were extremely excited to visit the KS2 classrooms and choose a reading partner. All of the children were supportive of each other and enjoyed the experience.

Throughout the day, each class created work based on an author or a book. Year 6 used 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan to discover how illustrations tell a story. Year 5 used a variety of famous characters from story books to write a detailed description and then challenged their partner to guess the character from the description. Year 4 based their work on Roald Dahl. This included researching and creating a biography, drawing and describing well known characters from his books and writing a poem in the style of his 'Revolting Rhymes'. Year 3 read the new books they collected with their voucher in Waterstones on their class trip and wrote a book recommendation.

Year 2 chose a character from a story and wrote a riddle to describe it for their partner to solve. They also made puppets to re-enact their favourite stories. Year 1 read the 'Quangle Wangle's Hat' and used the description to draw their own amazing hat. Reception shared picture books and drew pictures of their favourite characters. Nursery spent the morning reading their favourite books with Year 3.

At the end of the school day, we all came together in assembly to share our work. Prizes were awarded for the most inventive costume and one child in each year group won a £5 book voucher for WH Smiths.

The day was a great success and enjoyed by all the children and staff. Thank you to everyone who tried hard to come in costume and donated £1 to Book Aid International.


