

## Parent Notice - Start and End of school day

From September we will still be using our current system of letting the children into school. The gates will open at 8:45am and children can enter through any gate to go straight to their classroom.

Parents are requested not to come onto site without an appointment. If you need to speak to a teacher, you can do so at the gate or request an appointment.

At the end of the day pupils will be brought to an area of the playground where parents can collect them. There should be no parents waiting by school doors. There will be lots of signage to help you.

### - Nursery and Reception -

Parents can collect from EYFS playground

### - Year 1 and Year 2 -

Parents can collect from the KS1 playground (*behind the huts*)

### - Year 4 and Year 6 -

Parents can collect from the big playground

### - Year 3 and Year 5 -

Parents can collect from the MUGA.


(*parents will be allowed to walk through the school grounds to get to the different area if necessary*)

## UNICEF Rights of the Child



It's the end of the school year and with these 3 articles we have managed to share all the articles from the UNICEF Rights of the Child Convention. We hope you have learnt more about your and other children's rights and look forward to learning more next year.

### Article 1 (definition of the child)

Everyone under the age of 18 has all the rights in the Convention.

### Article 37 (inhumane treatment and detention)

Children must not be tortured, sentenced to the death penalty or suffer other cruel or degrading treatment or punishment. Children should be arrested, detained or imprisoned only as a last resort and for the shortest time possible. They must be treated with respect and care, and be able to keep in contact with their family. Children must not be put in prison with adults.

The Convention has 54 articles in total. Articles 43-54 are about how adults and governments must work together to make sure all children can enjoy all their rights, including: **Article 45** Unicef can provide expert advice and assistance on children's rights.
