Hope for Justice is a charity organisation carrying out excellent work safeguarding children and adults. They exist to bring an end to modern slavery by preventing exploitation, rescuing victims, restoring lives, and reforming society. Hope for Justice are a global charity working in many countries, including; United Kingdom, USA, Norway, Cambodia, Uganda and many more.

**PREVENT** - Outreach teams, self-help groups and community education initiatives empower people to protect themselves and their families from predatory traffickers and their recruiters.

**RESCUE** - Specialist teams work closely with police to identify victims of modern slavery, build bridges of trust with them and remove them from exploitation and into safety.

**RESTORE** - Work with victims to overcome trauma and rebuild their lives. Tailored care initiatives and support is given to meet vital needs, including survivor-centred aftercare.

**REFORM** - Train professionals to spot the signs of trafficking and to respond, and campaign for policy change. Help businesses protect their operations and supply chains from modern slavery.



## HOPE FOR JUSTICE

Modern Slavery and Trafficking is an issue that should not be ignored. Victims are often hidden away, but it is possible you will encounter individuals or situations of concern. Knowing how to 'spot the signs' could save lives.
