Operation Encompass is a police and education early information sharing partnership enabling schools to offer immediate support for children and young people experiencing domestic abuse. Information is shared by the police with a school's trained Key Adult prior to the start of the next school day after officers have attended a domestic abuse incident, enabling appropriate support to be given, dependent upon the needs and wishes of the child. At the Academy we are working closely with families, the Police and other agencies to ensure Domestic Abuse is reported and that the right support is given to the pupils at our school.
