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Year 6 Oxford Trip



On Friday 27th February, 10 children from year 6 were fortunate to enjoy a day in Oxford. We arrived at school at 7am ready to embark on the 2 hour journey to Oxford University where we were given a guided tour. Firstly, we explored Keble College where we were shown the common room, chapel, gardens and the main dining hall, which looks like the one in the Harry Potter films. Keble College is one of the largest colleges in Oxford University, as well as being one of the newest, despite the fact that it was founded in 1870. Following that we were able to explore the site of one of the oldest colleges, New College. The spectacular buildings date back to 1379, which is why some of us thought they looked like castles. After learning about life at Oxford University, we spent the afternoon at The Museum of the History of Science which was fascinating and also a bit terrifying! The taught session gave us an insight into animals and how scientists learn about different species. Some of us felt particularly brave and were able to hold a live cockroach and tarantula; others sat there feeling very nervous. Thank you to the parents who joined us on the day. We hope everyone enjoyed it and learnt something new.
