

School will start back on Wednesday 2nd September 2020

Nursery and Reception will need to check their Reception & Nursery packs of confirmation to check which day/ hours their child will be starting on.

Due to Covid-19 precautions and Government guidelines, there will be staggered start and end times for school as well as assigned gates for entrance for at least the first half of Autumn term. Any families that have siblings in more than one year group can all arrive together at the earliest start time and will leave at the latest start time. Further information can be found on the school website and social media platforms, or you can call the school office. A leaflet will be shared just before we come back to school to let you know about the changes and expectations for September. If you have anything you feel you need to share about your child prior to their return to school, you can call the office to speak to their class teacher. A reminder about this will be sent before we return in September.

School times: EYFS ~ 9.00-3.30 Lower Stuart Street (by Year 1)

- Y1 ~ 8.45-3.15 Lower Stuart Street
- Y2~ 8.45-3.15 Lower Stuart Street
- Y3 ~ 9.00- 3.30 Butlin Street
- Y4 ~ 9.00-3.30 Upper Stuart Street (into the playground)
- Y5 ~ 8.45-3.15 Butlin Street
- Y6 ~ 8.45-3.15 Upper Stuart Street

We are aware these changes may cause some inconvenience but we must stick to the Government guidance and consider the health and safety risks to the whole school community, so we ask for your continued understanding and support.

Parents/ children **will not** be permitted to walk through site and must enter and exit through their own gate only. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience this may cause but we must follow the guidance given and hope that this is a temporary measure.

Other changes you may notice;

Parents will only be allowed on site by appointment. Any queries you may have , we would ask that you phone or email the office only.

Please adhere to social distancing at the gates, we are all role models to the children. Teachers will be at the gates to open them at the appropriate time and they will close after 10 mins. Please be punctual. If you are late please come to Butlin Street entrance and buzz the office.

There will be a limited breakfast club from 8.15. Initially, this will be prioritized for working parents and we will extend this as soon as is manageable. There will be a booking system and we will share information about this during the first week back. Breakfast club will start on **07.09.20**.

Uniform: Children will be expected to wear uniform in September

St Clement's uniform consists of grey or black trousers, grey or navy skirt/pinafore, a white polo shirt or shirt and a navy jumper or cardigan. The school uniform with badge can be purchased from Trutex Schoolwear, Erdington High Street, B23 6SA.

Pupils are expected to wear black shoes or boots and trainers are not appropriate. Headscarves, if worn should be plain black, navy or grey.

PE kit- navy polo shirt and plain black or navy bottoms/shorts/leggings

Please remember that jewellery is **not allowed** to be worn in school, except for a small pair of studs. This is for the health and safety of all our pupils. Nail polish should not be worn.
