We are pleased to announce that we will be running our Year 5 and 6 residential at PGL Boreatton Park for the second time in September.

On the residential your child will be able to take part in a number of activities such as rock climbing, abseiling, quad biking and canoeing. It is also an opportunity for them to learn new life skills that they wouldn't learn in the classroom.

The total cost of the residential is £50 per child, which includes a £10 non-refundable deposit. If you have more than one child coming to the residential, the cost will be reduced to £40 per child.

To secure your child's place you need to pay a £10 deposit no later than **FRIDAY 21st JULY** to the school office. The full payment can be paid throughout the school year with our payment plan.

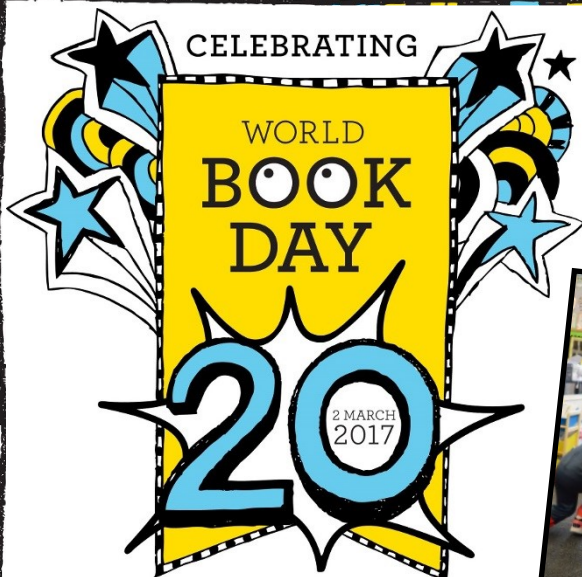

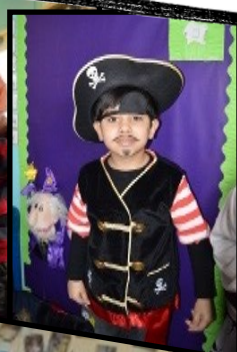
