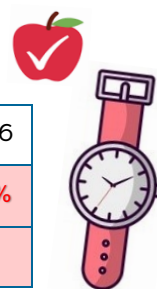

Easter holiday club:

Bring it on Brum! is running FREE activity clubs in Birmingham for those aged 4-16 who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals. Clubs will run for 4 or 8 days during the spring (Easter) school holidays; Monday 3rd to Thursday 6th April and Tuesday 11th to Friday 14th April 2023.

Each child is eligible to attend a maximum of four sessions during the spring school holidays.

Activities include sports and games, arts and crafts, cookery, dance, and music. Programmes will vary depending on the type and location of each local club, but every day there will be a nutritious meal served up for free! (you can get a code for this from school)

For families with children who are not able to access face-to-face holiday clubs, activity packs are also available for the spring school holiday. Packs are available for primary or secondary age based on one per eligible child.

Families can register for a free spring activity pack from Monday 13th March 2023; **registrations close on Wednesday 22nd March 2023 or as soon as all activity packs have been allocated.**

Football Cards

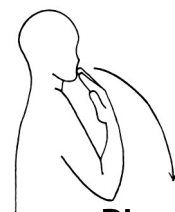
There have been a couple of incidents over the last couple of weeks with children falling out over football cards they are bringing into school.

ASTON HALL

UNICEF Rights of the Child



Article 9: Keeping Families Together

Children should not be separated from their parents unless they are not being properly looked after – for example, if a parent hurts or does not take care of a child. Children whose parents don't live together should stay in contact with both parents unless this might harm the child.



Article 11: Protection from Kidnapping

Governments must stop children being taken out of the country when this is against the law – for example, being kidnapped by someone or held abroad by a parent when the other parent does not agree.

Household Support Fund



Birmingham City Council's wider Household Support Fund (HSF) activity for this Winter is now available. They will be distributing grants of up to £200 to Birmingham households currently facing hardship, intended for support with food and energy payments.

- You must be a Birmingham Resident
- You must be experiencing hardship, particularly with regards to covering costs linked to food and energy
- You must not have received a hardship grant payment since April 2022

You will need to provide proof of address and proof of means-tested benefits (if you are in receipt of them) in the case that you apply.
