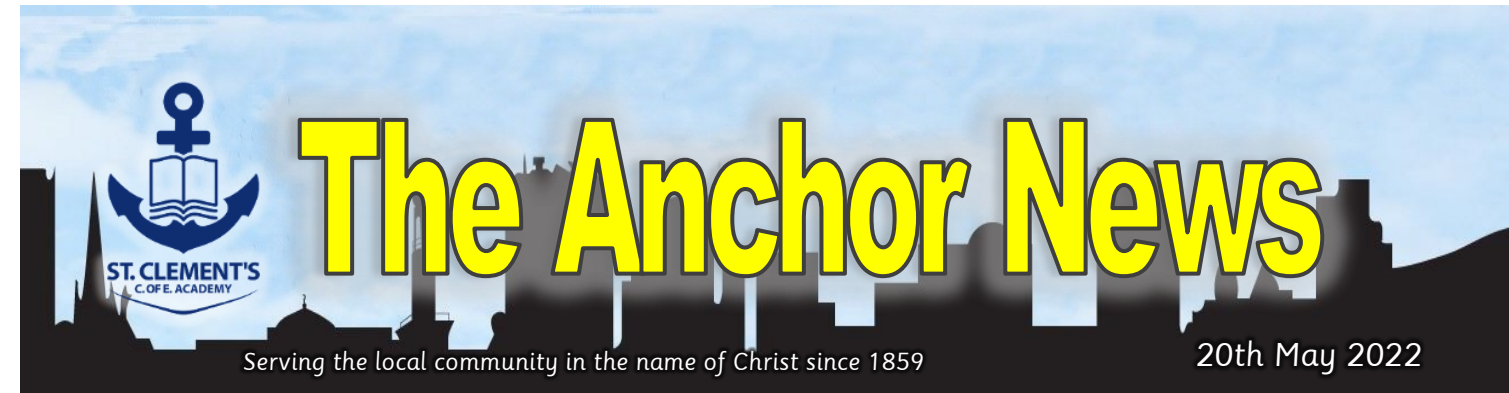

Building Work Notice

Over the second part of Summer term the work will begin on our KS1 classrooms. It is a really exciting project that will result in brand new classrooms for year 1 and 2. The work will take 10 weeks in total and will begin on July 1st. Unfortunately, this will cause some disruption to classes in school but we have organised what we can to make this as minimal as we possibly can. The KS1 classes will be moving on June 27th to their temporary homes. Year 2 will move into the library and year 1 will move into the hall. There will be no access from the lower Stuart Street gate. Children should be dropped off and picked up at the Butlin Street gate at the start and end of day.

We will keep you informed as work commences.



Safeguarding: Attendance

It is important that if your child is absent, you contact the school office - 0121 464 4652. It is a safeguarding concern if we are unable to speak with families regarding a child's absence from school.

Firstly, we will try the contact numbers we have listed (please keep all contact numbers up to date), leave a message, and allow a short period for a call to be returned to school. If contact is still not made, we will then carry out a home visit. These steps will be repeated until contact is made. Where contact cannot be made or concerns increase, a referral to the Police for a Safe and Well Check or Children Missing in Education may be made.

It is important that when children are not in school, we know where they are and that they are safe and well. Also, good attendance is vital for a child's routine, wellbeing, and academic progress.

If you have concerns regarding attendance, punctuality or illness please speak with a member of school staff.



We have seen a huge increase in pupils arriving late for school over the past few weeks.

We would like to remind everyone of the importance of ensuring everyone is at school on time, every day.

Being late is really disruptive to the school day and has an impact on everyone's learning.

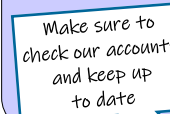
