Safeguarding at St. Clement's is paramount and at the heart of all that we do. We have developed a curriculum that teaches children a variety of 'keeping safe' skills and highlights important topics for discussions and helps the children address more local or personal

Safequarding within the academy is dealt with daily by Miss Akers. However, there are several staff members involved in Safeguarding within the school - Mrs Nizamis, Mrs Price and Miss Shryane. All staff receive regular training to ensure they are up to date in all matters, which enables them to best support the families of St. Clement's.

Alongside our curriculum, we also work with other agencies such as, the NHS, Police, Birmingham and Solihull Women's Aid, Children's Trusts, Early Help Hub, Brother's Keeper and Free @ Last. We also have staff trained in Trauma Informed Therapies, Thrive and Attachment.

Jigsaw and Personal Development lessons are dĕlivered twice weekly, as well as workshops throughout the academic year to support key topics. Child Safety Week is celebrated, along with Mental Health Day/Week, Anti Bullying Week, Online Safety Week/Day and other key

The Pastoral Team also ensure a wide range of interventions and supports are available for pupils and families. If you would like more information regarding how Safeguarding is managed within the school, the safeguarding curriculum or any other matter relating to safeguarding then please see Miss Akers or a member of the Safeguarding Team. 
