<u>Safequarding:</u> Violence Against Women



Did you know that at least one in three women will experience some form of violence during their lifetime - more than one billion women worldwide?

Violence against women and girls is a hidden global crisis which knows no boundaries of geography or culture. Violence against women and girls takes many different forms, including domestic violence, sexual assault and harassment, child, early and forced marriage, trafficking, so called 'honour' crimes and FGM. It is rooted in the gender inequality that women face throughout their lives from childhood through to old age.

Many perpetrators believe that violence toward women and girls is normal or appropriate behaviour, supported by society. They feel that they can commit violence without disapproval.

It is one of the most widespread violations of human rights and has long-term devastating effects on the lives of women, their communities and wider society.

It is time to say, 'enough is enough'. We want violence against women to end.

Athe start of this week we sent home a letter regarding the building works that will start next half term. We are really excited about this project that will result in brand new classrooms for year 1 and 2.


