END VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

Did you know that at least one in three women will experience some form of violence during their lifetime - more than one billion women worldwide?

Violence against women and girls is a hidden global crisis which knows no boundaries of geography or culture. Violence against women and girls takes many different forms, including domestic violence, sexual assault and harassment, child, early and forced marriage, trafficking, so called 'honour' crimes and FGM. It is rooted in the gender inequality that women face throughout their lives from childhood through to old age.

If you have concerns regarding violence towards yourself or someone you know then please ask for help.

Many perpetrators believe that violence toward women and girls is normal or appropriate behaviour, supported by society. They feel that they can commit violence without disapproval.

It is one of the most widespread violations of human rights and has long-term devastating effects on the lives of women, their communities and wider society.

It is time to say, 'enough is enough'. We want violence against women to end.

Unfortunately, we have seen an increased number of pupils wearing incorrect uniform.

Uniform is worn in school to deepen the understanding that we are all one and part of the same school family, so that children feel a sense of belonging. It also helps as a level playing field for all pupils. We are aware of costs to our families especially at this time, which is why we do not encourage expensive items of clothing, footwear or jewellery be worn.

May we remind you that trainers in any form are not school uniform. If pupils are wearing plimsols they should be just black with no additional colours or patterns.

Headscarves should be plain black, blue or grey (white can be worn in summer). The scarf should be the elasticated/ one piece type, not long wrapped scarves for health and safety reason.




KS1 classes will move on June 27th to their temporary homes.
