I hope everyone has a restful but more importantly, safe weekend.



- \* Do not buy fireworks from UNLICENCED retailers. These fireworks may be unsafe and illegal.
- \* Only buy fireworks that comply with current safety standards.
- \* Always keep fireworks in a closed box. Take them out one at a time and close the box.
- \* Never put fireworks in your pocket.
- Be considerate. Let your neighbours know you will be having a display, especially if they are elderly or they have pets or children.
- Avoid setting fireworks off late at night, particularly if it is a school-night.
- \* Ensure your pets are safe.
- Carefully follow the instructions on EACH firework.
- Never go back to a lit firework unless the instructions advise otherwise.
- Never throw fireworks; it is dangerous.
- Light fireworks one at a time, at the end of the fuse, and at arm's length.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear suitable gloves, even when lighting them.
- Never give sparklers to a child under the age of 5.
- Never throw spent fireworks on a bonfire.

### Article 22: Refugee children

Children who move from their home country to another country as refugees (because it was not safe for them to stay there) should get help and protection and have the same rights as children born in that country.




### Article 38: Protection in war

Safeguarding: Child Safety Week

This week, in school, the children have celebrated Child Safety Week. Throughout the week, we have looked at and learnt about a variety of topics. 'People who Keep us Safe' – children identified 'trusted adults' and were able to discuss the roles of the Emergency Services. They also, in some year groups, looked at safe and unsafe situations, gang activity, exploitation and knife crime. Another area covered was Healthy Bodies. During these sessions children looked at keeping physically and mentally healthy, mental ill health conditions, exercise, drugs/alcohol/tobacco, nutrition and climate change.





A parent workshop was also delivered by Dr Ewan Hamnet, where he discussed the importance of staying healthy, the rise and crisis of childhood type 2 Diabetes and the impact unhealthy lifestyles have on the planet. Fire Safety and Bonfire Night were also part of the week and children have learnt the history relating to Bonfire Night as well as how to stay safe around fire and prevention. Children also looked at Water, Road and Rail Safety. We ended the week with an assembly on 'Being a Good Friend' and asking for help when we need it. This supported the work the children have done this week on Anti Bullying, the importance of kindness and their right to be safe. We hope to spread the messages to children and adults far and wide that when you need help or are feeling low.....REACH OUT! Because there is always someone at the academy who will help.


