No other jewellery should be worn and children will be asked to remove any jewellery and it will be handed back at the end of the day. Thank you.






- Safeguarding -

Thank you to all of the parents who came to support Year 2 learning about money. We had a fantastic time pretending to run our own shop and practising finding the right money to pay for all of our items!





This week Year 3 have been learning more about measures and capacity. Our week started with a visit from Graham, the manager of a juice bar. He talked to the class about how he uses maths every day in his job, with a particular focus on the importance of measuring accurately and being able to read scales correctly. He left the class with a challenge! Graham invited year 3 to design and make their own juice which had to total 500ml. After working to order, compare, and subtract amounts in both millilitres and litres, Year 3 invited their parents in to work alongside them in ordering amounts, finding all possible combinations and then designing their new juices. Everyone worked collaboratively to create a recipe that met the criteria and then to taste and give feedback. It was brilliant to have so many parents come and work alongside their children.

During Maths week, Year 4 have been learning how to estimate and measure length in millimetres (mm), centimetres (cm) and metres (m). On Tuesday, Austen visited us to explain how he used measurements when mountain climbing. We estimated the length of different climbing rope and accurately measured the rope to help Austen climb Snowdonia. On Wednesday, some of our parents came into school to work with us. We solved two-step measure problems and showed off our new skills by measuring the distance a car travelled down a mountain at different heights. If you need any help measuring, then ask someone in Year 4 to help you!





This week, Year 5 have been learning through our 'Project Runway'. We had a fun parent workshop, applying our measuring skills to design an outfit for a mannequin. We had to use the measurements to draw and cut out clothes to fit a mannequin.

Thank you to the parents who attended the workshop during maths week. We looked at how hairdressers used ratio in the workplace. We had to work out ratios of colour to peroxide to enable a hairdresser to correctly colour hair. We calculated a cost to colour a whole bridal party. The workshop helped parents to see an area of measures that Year 6 have to cover.
