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



Safeguarding: Staying Safe

This coming week we will be looking at Article 19 from the Unicef Rights of the Child which you can read below.

UNICEF Rights of the Child



Article 19: (protection from violence, abuse and neglect)


Governments must do all they can to ensure that children are protected from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect and bad treatment by their parents or anyone else who looks after them.

As a school we educate the children on their rights and the treatment they should receive from people who care for them. Children from Nursery to Year 6 take part in activities that help them understand the importance of being safe from harm. When we discuss with the children 'staying safe from harm' we discuss both physical and emotional abuse, as well as other forms of violence, neglect, or bad treatment.

Children are taught to share concerns or worries around being at risk from harm with trusted adults who will help them. We also educate them on other agencies that can support children such as, Childline, NSPCC and Birmingham Children's Services.
