
If they are during school time, could you please ensure you have a letter or appointment card as your child may not be marked as medical without it.



This Week's Attendance & Punctuality


Attendance and punctuality are very important to help assist the children with their learning. Being absent or late disrupts not only their learning but that of their classmates.










- Waste must be brought in person to the Mobile Household Recycling Centre (MHRC) during this time.














Road Safety

Household Support **Fund**



Birmingham City Council's wider Household Support Fund (HSF) activity for this Winter is now available. They will be distributing grants of up to £200 to Birmingham households currently facing hardship, intended for support with food and energy

- · You must be a Birmingham Resident
- · You must be experiencing hardship, particularly with regards to covering costs linked to food and energy
- You must not have received a hardship grant payment since April 2022

You will need to provide proof of address and proof of means-tested benefits (if you are in receipt of them) in the case that you apply.
