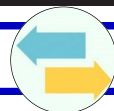

Humility



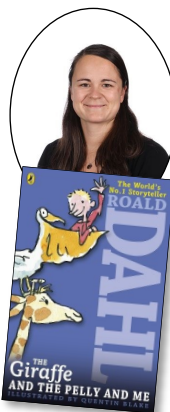

Safeguarding:

The Government and Ofsted recently carried out a report into sexual harassment and violence in schools. The report has highlighted that schools need to ensure they are effectively teaching children about consent, healthy relationships, respect, law, and kindness.

At the academy, our PSHE and Personal Development Curriculum is paramount. We ensure pupils receive quality teaching in a variety of ways and learn how to safeguard themselves both emotionally and physically. Children also get the opportunity to work with the local PCSO Team, Birmingham and Solihull Women's Aid, Birmingham Nursing Team and other agencies that offer support to schools. We are proud that our children can talk about how to stay safe and what makes a good friend as this will enable them to make positive choices as they mature.

UNICEF Rights of the Child



Article 27 (adequate
standard of living)

Children have the right to food, clothing and a safe place to live so they can develop in the best possible way. The government should help families and children who cannot afford this.



Article 34
(sexual exploitation)

The government should protect children from sexual exploitation (being taken advantage of) and sexual abuse, including by people forcing children to have sex for money, or making sexual pictures or films of them.



Article 42
(knowledge
of rights)

Governments should actively tell children and adults about this Convention so that everyone knows about children's rights.
