#### **Safequarding:** Child Abuse linked to Faith

Child abuse linked to faith or belief is a hidden crime, which makes it difficult to quantify in terms of magnitude. Cases have been recorded worldwide across various communities and religions. Abuse may happen anywhere but is most commonly within the child's home.

There are a variety of definitions associated with abuse linked to faith or belief. The National Action Plan includes the following. The concept of belief in:

- witchcraft and spirit possession, demons or the devil acting through children or
- · leading them astray.
- the evil eye or djinns and dakini.
- ritual or multi murders where the killing of children is believed to bring supernatural benefits, or the use of their body parts is believed to produce potent magical remedies.
- use of belief in magic or witchcraft to create fear in children to make them more compliant when they are being trafficked for domestic slavery or exploitation.

## Signs a child may be undergoing abuse linked to faith or belief

Most of the indicators may appear similar to other types of abuse and include when a child

- Reports that they are or have been accused of being evil, and / or that they are having the devil beaten out of
- Is made to wear some form of paraphernalia that could be of a religious nature.
- · Personal care deteriorates or has body marks, such as bruises or burns
- Is seen as the scapegoat for a change in family circumstances for the worse
- In a group of children is relatively powerless, maybe a child with no essential role in the family
- Attendance at school becomes irregular, or is taken out of school altogether without another school place having been organised

#### What to do if you suspect a child is at risk of abuse linked to faith or belief

If you are worried about a child, you should follow your normal safeguarding procedures, ensuring you mention you are concerned the child may be a victim of abuse linked to faith and abuse and the reasons why you are concerned. You can also contact the Police on the non-emergency, 24/7 number: 101. If you are concerned that the child is in immediate danger, contact the police by calling 999.

You should also contact the Foreign and Commonwealth Office if the child has been taken abroad and you are concerned for their safetu:

You can also speak with a member of the school Safeguarding Team if you would like further information, support, or quidance.

#### Parents Reminder: Parking!

Please be mindful of the impression you leave on your children by your own behaviour.

There is only 1 week left of the school year, and whilst it is slightly inconvenient to park further away from the gates and walk, we ask that you consider this for the next few days to keep both the children and yourself safe.

If these issues continue we will look at approaching the council for a no park zone outside school.


