
Year 3 trip to Pizza Express






Year 1trip to Wing Yip





Safeguarding: Country Lines



It is likely you will have heard the term 'County Lines' in the news recently. This is a real and growing form of criminal activity that exists nationally and regionally, here in Birmingham and across the West Midlands. To explain, it is a term used to describe gangs and organised criminal networks involved in exporting illegal drugs from urban areas into rural areas. The leaders of these gangs are likely to exploit children and vulnerable adults, often without them realising it, to move (and store) drugs and money. They use coercion, intimidation, violence and weapons.

The term; 'Going Country', can also be used.



Birmingham schools are working together with West Midlands Police and partners to tackle this issue. At St. Clement's we educate children on how to stay safe, making choices and positive relationships.
