Please note This year due to COVID we will not be able to take Sibling or Family photos.





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

UNICEF Rights of the Child



Article 22 (refugee children)

If a child is seeking refuge or has refugee status, governments must provide them with appropriate protection and assistance to help them enjoy all the rights in the Convention. Governments must help refugee children who are separated from their parents to be reunited with them.
