Spotlight Programme

As you are aware attendance is a hig focus here at St. Clement's. To enable us to uphold a high level of attendance at school we run the Spotlight programme.

Letters about this programme were sent out to all families last week highlighting the importance of being in school and the consequences of term time absence.

Leave during term time will not be authorised (except where the circumstances are exceptional) If you take leave that has not been authorised this may end up leading to a penalty notice and legal action being taken.

We have previously had families that were identified as having children with persistent unauthorised absences and through the Spotlight Programme these families were fined over £500 each for continued unauthorised absence.

This is something we do not like to do but is necessary for the welfare of all children attending St. Clement's. I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that the Spotlight is still running at school and attendance of all children is monitored on a weekly basis.


