Again, thank you so much for all your contributions and support as without you we couldn't do it.



Safeguarding: WHAT IS 'FAKE NEWS'?

Fake news can be false information, photos or videos purposefully created to confuse or misinform. It can also be genuine information that has been manipulated to deceive. It is important that we learn how to distinguish between real news and fake news.





Many fake news stories are written with appealing headlines and have content designed to create 'shock value' in order to spread like wildfire. Typically, fake news will include topics such as the 'death' of a famous person, company giveaways, news relating to supernatural events, or terror related posts that provoke a reaction. Have a look at

other news sources to see if a story has been widely reported before sharing unsubstantiated claims. You can also check facts at websites, including <u>snopes.com</u> and <u>factcheck.org</u>.

Read more than just the headline!

Some news sites will post stories with 'click bait' headlines to

grab your attention and make you click on them. These headlines might not even be relevant to the story. Studies show that almost 60% of links that people have shared on social media have never actually been clicked before sharing, so it's really important that you read the article first before you share it to make sure the news is real.




