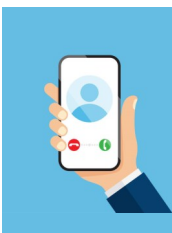

Start and End of school day

From September we will still be using our current system of letting the children into school. The gates will open at 8:45am and children can enter through any gate to go straight to their classroom. Gates will close at 8:55am.
