Keep safe and God bless you all.



- Safeguarding: Private Fostering -



We would like to bring to your attention the term 'Private Fostering'. This is something that we have seen an increase in across the city and hope that by sharing it with families it gives you a better understanding of the term and the procedures that apply to it.

Private Fostering

Private fostering is where parents make arrangements with someone outside of their close family to look after their child for them for 28 days or longer.

Many private fostering arrangements remain hidden and private foster children have been identified as a potentially vulnerable group. Many professionals who work with children and young people in the city will come across private fostering situations. Private foster carers and the parents of private foster children have a legal duty to notify the Local Authority about these arrangements, but this duty is not widely known, and they are rarely reported. It is vital that Children's Social Care is made aware of such arrangements so that they can safeguard the welfare of potentially vulnerable children.

Private fostering is an arrangement by which a child under 16 (or under 18 if disabled):

- Does not live with a parent (or step parent),
- Is cared for by an adult who is not a close relative (in this context a close relative is a grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, including both full and half relations and relations by marriage),
- Is in a private arrangement made by the parent and the carer,
- Is being cared for by a carer in a different home which lasts, or is intended to last, for a continuous period of 28 days or more.
